

Wi-Fi Alliance Member Dues and Fees

Once a membership application is accepted by the Board of Directors of the Wi-Fi Alliance, and the applicant has submitted a signed Membership Agreement and Intellectual Property Rights Acknowledgment form (not applicable for Adopter membership applicants), a written notice is sent via e-mail to the applying company and the membership dues invoice is prepared and delivered with the notice. Payment is due upon receipt of the invoice and the new member's membership will not be activated until full payment is received.

The Wi-Fi Alliance bills its members annually in advance for each calendar year membership period and all dues are payable prior to the beginning of the membership year. A late fee of ten (10) percent will be assessed to dues not paid by January 31. Failure to pay membership dues within thirty (30) days after they become due payable is a basis for suspension of membership. After suspension, if a member does not pay its dues, the member shall be terminated according to the Bylaws of the Wi-Fi Alliance. Suspended or terminated members lose all participatory membership privileges until all outstanding dues and fees are paid in full.

Annual membership dues are \$15,000 (US Dollars) for Regular members and \$5,000 (US Dollars) for Adopter members. Dues for companies joining during the period January 1 - June 30 will be billed \$15,000 for Regular membership or \$5,000 for Adopter membership. Companies joining during the period July 1 - December 31 will be billed \$7,500 for Regular membership or \$2,500 for Adopter membership. The pro-rated membership dues apply to new members only.

Existing members who allow their membership to lapse through nonpayment of dues are required to pay the full dues in the year their membership lapses in order to reinstate the membership. After the initial year of non-membership, former members are regarded as new members for purposes of dues and will be entitled to pro-rated dues on that basis. (For example, a company that was a member in 2006, but did not renew membership for 2007 would be considered a new member if it re-joined in 2008.)

Qualified subsidiaries of a Regular or Sponsor member may become Affiliate members and participate in membership activities without paying additional dues. For a subsidiary company to qualify for Affiliate membership, its parent company must be a Regular or Sponsor member in good standing and must directly or indirectly control more than 50 (fifty) percent of the voting power or equity in the subsidiary company. Affiliate members have the same rights as Regular members, however hold no voting rights unless via written proxy by the parent company that is a Regular or Sponsor member in good standing.
